Mr. Baum began his career in public service as the youngest member in the history of the Orange County Legislature, serving as minority leader from 1994-97. He went on to serve in New York State government, first as Chief of Staff in the Office of the New York State Attorney General, followed by a tenure as Secretary to the Governor (the governor's senior-most advisor). Prior to joining NYU in 2011, he was Chief Operating Officer at the New York Academy of Sciences, one of the oldest scientific academies in the country. Mr. Baum earned his B.A. degree in history from Cornell University.

"Over the past 12 years at NYU, Rich Baum has proven himself to be a natural and outstanding leader," said **NYU President Andrew Hamilton**. "Smart, strategic, focused, straightforward, and a person of great integrity, Rich has been an inestimable colleague, a person that others look to get things done, seek out for sage advice when confronting challenges, and know they can rely on.
